

## **EABP STUDENT THESIS AWARD**

### **Conditions of entry**

- The prize will be awarded to the best thesis of a student of body psychotherapy
- The thesis must have a theoretical and a practical part and must be a substantive piece of written work.
- Student must be studying at a Training Institute that is an organizational member of EABP
- A thesis abstract must be translated into English - no longer than 3000 words
- Case studies/research must have been conducted according to the EABP Ethical Guidelines
- The thesis must not have been written before 2010
- The EABP has the right to publish the English language abstracts of all prize submissions in the International Body Psychotherapy Journal and on the website
- Students retain all copyright and the right to publish elsewhere as well but must inform the EABP first
- The jury will be composed of at least three representatives from the FORUM elected by the FORUM. A trainer of the students cannot be members of the jury.
- The EABP Board of Directors retains the right to adapt these conditions according to the circumstances, though not to favour any one particular entry.

### **Criteria for Assessment**

The theses will be judged on:

- 2 points for originality of thinking
- 1 point for referencing well enough
- 2 points for description of theory
- 2 points for description of practice
- 2 points for integration of theory and practice, including depth of handling of the subject
- 1 point for language and structure of the written piece
